- It is celebrated on 8th day that is 'Ashtami' of the dark fortnight that is 'Krishna Paksha' in Shravan and Bhadon month.









BIRTH OF SRI KRISHNA

Long long ago, Mathura was ruled by Kansa, a ruthless and evil king who had kept his father captive and snatched the throne from him






Kansa's sister, princess Devaki, got married to Vasudeva, a noble man




But, on their wedding day, a voice from the heavens sounded a terrible prophesy...

A frightened Kansa didn't want to take any chances. He immediately put Devaki and Vasudeva behind bars







But, when Devaki conceived for the seventh time, the Gods transferred the embryo to the womb of Rohini, Vasudeva's second wife



This seventh child was named Balaram and was an incarnation of the Shesh Nag, the ten-headed cobra on whom Vishmu always rested




















Krishna was left with Nanda and his wife, Yashoda, while Vasudeva took their baby girl and returned to the prison

DAHI HANDI

- ❖ In dahi handi earthen pot filled with dahi, makhan, ghee, sweets and nuts is hung at a height.
- ❖ Then, a group of young boys make a human pyramid to get to the handi and break it.
- * Lord Krishna used to steal makhan from his neighbours. This habit earned him the name 'Navneet Chor'.
- The frustrated women in the village used to hung the curd, butter and milk in a handi at a height so he cannot reach it.
- * Krishna and his friends made human pyramids to reach the handi, break it and distribute it among themselves.
- ❖ Dahi handi is celebrated as a sweet remembrance of his childhood days.
- ❖ It is all about teamwork, coordination, focus and strength.
- ❖ The people who form the pyramid are called 'Govinda Pathak'.

The idea behind this ritual is to develop brotherhood, strength and coordination among young minds, so that they stand by each other.
